- 14. Members appreciated the intent of the Presentation and Council
- a. noted
  - i. That the State Action on Business Enabling Reforms (SABER) Programme was a USD **750** million 3-Year (**2023-2025**) performance-based intervention, being implemented by the Federal ministry of Budget *and* National Planning, the Secretariat of the Presidential Enabling Business Environment Council, Debt Management Office and the Nigeria Governor's Forum Secretariat, and supported with financing from the World Bank;
  - ii. That the SABER was central to the Federal Government's efforts at **improving** the efficiency of land administration, the regulatory framework for private investments in fibre optic infrastructure, services provided by investment promotion Agencies and Office of Public Private Partnership, and the efficiency' and transparency of Government-to-business services in participating States;
- iii. That Lagos State was participating in the SABER and vas actively implementing the various reform deliverables towards achieving all the Disbursement Linked Indicators;

  - i. the publication of the 2025 Business Enabling Reform Action Plan (BERAP) Focal Persons memorandum on the State's official website, for full implementation by the relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies of the State Government.
